NOTICE UNDER SECTION 119C OF THE FILMS, VIDEOS, AND PUBLICATIONS
CLASSIFICATION ACT 1993**

Re: 2024/328 2019 Christchurch Terrorist Attack Discussion Showing Livestream Content

An Inspector of Publications reasonably believes a publication hosted by the Online Content Host is objectionable.

Under 119C of the Films, Videos, and Publications Classification Act 1993 (the Act), you are required to remove an online publication from your platform.

Details on the material are provided in Schedule A.

A publication is [objectionable](#) if it describes, depicts, expresses, or otherwise deals with matters such as sex, horror, crime, cruelty, or violence in such a manner that the availability of the publication is likely to be injurious to the public good. It is illegal to make, possess, supply or distribute objectionable content in New Zealand.

You must remove, or prevent access by the New Zealand public to, the online publication as soon as is reasonably practicable after receipt of the notice and no later than **Monday, 22 January 2024 5.00pm NZST**.

Failure to comply may result in enforcement proceedings, outlined under section [119H](#) of the Act.

The Department does not require you to preserve a copy of the online publication.

You may preserve a copy of the publication if you:

- intend to lodge, or have lodged, a submission under section [13\(1\)\(ba\)](#) for a classification decision for the relevant online publication;
- have an application for a review under [Part 4](#) against the classification decision for the relevant online publication;
- have lodged a notice of [appeal](#) related to that application for review.

You must still comply with the take-down notice by removing or preventing New Zealand public access to the online publication.



Right of review or consideration

Pursuant to [section 119J](#) of the Act, a take-down notice may be reviewed only as part of a review under [Part 4](#) of the classification decision relating to the relevant online publication.

Under [section 13](#), an online content host who has been issued with a take-down notice relating to an online publication may submit the publication to the Classification Office for a classification decision. This must be submitted within 20 working days of receiving the take-down notice.
